If we add anything to the Cross and Resurrection, we depart from the Gospel.

The Gospel; Good news; When our strength, intelligence, discipline, knowledge fall short, God sends the Holy Spirit to save us. He makes us look better than we really are. Requirement? Trust in Jesus Christ.
